## Audience

This manual is intended for installers and system administrators of the AlterPath PM and for users who may be authorized to manage power through the AlterPath PM. It assumes that the reader understands networking basics and is familiar with the terms and concepts used in Local and Wide Area Networking.

This document describes configuration, administration, and use of the AlterPath PM only. It does not describe how to set up and administer other external services or servers that the AlterPath PM may access.

# Chapter 1 Introduction

The AlterPath PM is an intelligent power distribution unit (IPDU) that enables remote power control of servers and network gear. When used in conjunction with Cyclades console servers or KVM devices, the AlterPath PM delivers easier management capabilities and faster problem solving by integrating console/KVM access and power control into one single interface.

The following sections describe general features common to all PM models in addition to pointing out specific features of certain units.

## Description

The following sections describe common features among all AlterPath PM units.

#### Alarms and Monitoring

The AlterPath PM delivers accurate, real-time global current monitoring of all connected devices via the user interface screen or locally through an LED digital display. Users have the ability to set a current alarm threshold that, once exceeded, will cause the AlterPath PM to sound an alarm or send a notification message, or both. The LED current display also blinks when the alarm threshold is exceeded.

#### Sequential Power Up

The AlterPath PM incorporates a sequential power up feature that prevents all power outlet receptacles from turning on at once, eliminating the potential of current surges that could render the equipment inoperable. Together with the global current monitoring, the sequential power-up feature lets users safely install more equipment on existing power circuits without the worry of current overloads.

#### Support for Daisy Chaining

The IPDU has a fixed number of power-outlet receptacles, but with daisy chaining capabilities, users can increase capacity by connecting the control interfaces of several AlterPath PMs in a series.

### Creation of User Accounts

The AlterPath PM allows one administrator and up to eight users (not simultaneously) to connect to it through its RS-232 serial port. After a successful authentication, it performs the following functions:

- Reads and displays the total current being used by the entire AlterPath PM.
- Manages power outlets (by powering them on and off, locking and unlocking them, and/or power cycling them).
- Manages users.
- Monitors power variables.
- Can be used as a stand-alone IPDU (independent of any other hardware) and controlled by any simple terminal access program like Minicom on Linux or HyperTerminal on Microsoft operating systems.

## Integration with Cyclades Management Products

When used with the ACS/TS family, the OnSite, or the KVM family, the AlterPath PM offers a superior feature set that is not fully covered in this manual. Please refer to the appropriate Cyclades documentation for more information on how to use the AlterPath PM with your specific implementation.

## **Hardware Configuration Options**

The AlterPath PM can be used in one of three hardware configurations:

- Standalone Managed independently of any other hardware device. See "Standalone Configuration" on page 4.
- Daisy-chained Multiple slave PMs connected to one another and managed by one master PM.

See "Daisy-chained Configuration" on page 5.

• Integrated – Managed by a Cyclades TS, AlterPath ACS, AlterPath OnSite, one of the AlterPath KVM products, or by any other console/ terminal management device.

See "Integrated Configuration" on page 6.

### Standalone Configuration

In a standalone configuration, the AlterPath PM operates independently of any other hardware such as the TS or ACS. The following graphic displays a PM with the console port connected to a computer running HyperTerminal, Kermit, or Minicom.




Figure 1-1: Standalone Configuration

**Note:** The previous graphic displays the PM being connected to the local work station with the RJ-45 to DB-9F adapter that is shipped with the product. If your work station does not have a DB-9M COM port, you may need to use a USB serial adapter in order to connect to the computer's USB port.

#### **Daisy-chained Configuration**

In a daisy-chained configuration, multiple slave PMs are connected to one another and managed by a single master PM. The PMs are linked together with RJ-45 cables connected to one PMs OUT port and the other PM's IN port. This example shows four AlterPath PMs operating in a daisy-chained environment. PM #1 is connected to the local work station and is the "master" PM, while the other three PMs are "slaves."




Figure 1-2: Daisy-chained Configuration

**Note:** The previous graphic displays the PM being connected to the local work station with the RJ-45 to DB-9F adapter that is shipped with the product. If your work station does not have a DB-9M COM port, you may need to use a USB serial adapter in order to connect to the computer's USB port.

The PMs in the previous graphic are configured to be used independently of any other hardware such as the AlterPath ACS or Cyclades-TS.

#### Integrated Configuration

In an integrated configuration, the AlterPath PM is configured to work in conjunction with one of the following Cyclades management products:

- Cyclades-TS
- AlterPath ACS
- AlterPath OnSite
- AlterPath KVM family.

A user connects to the AlterPath PM by accessing the appropriate console port of the Cyclades management product. In this scenario, software configuration on and monitoring of the AlterPath PM is done through the Cyclades management product and not on the PM itself. The setup and configuration instructions for the Cyclades management products can be found in the appropriate documentation available at <u>http://www.cyclades.com/support/</u> <u>downloads.php</u>.




Figure 1-3: The AlterPath PM with a Cyclades Management Device

An integrated environment offers the following advantages:

- IT professionals can power off, power on, and reboot network devices using the same console management session from any location via telnet, Secure Shell (SSHv2), or through a secure web session. This can all be done without the need for physical access to the hardware.
- Ethernet connection is available through the Cyclades management products to which the AlterPath PM is connected. When used with Cyclades management product, the AlterPath PM allows you, via a configurable hotkey, to reboot servers without leaving your telnet/ssh session.
- The AlterPath PM inherits the security of the console server to which it is connected.

Daisy chaining PMs with the AlterPath ACS or Cyclades-TS is similar to the daisy-chained configuration as described in "Daisy-chained Configuration" on page 5; however, in the integrated configuration, the first AlterPath PM is connected to a Cyclades management device instead of a workstation.

## Accessing the System Console

Users and administrators can access the AlterPath PM either by making a direct console connection to the PM's IN port or by connecting the PM to a Cyclades console or KVM management device.

#### **Direct Console Access**

While using the PM device independently of other Cyclades devices, local users can connect directly to the system console port (the "IN" port) of the AlterPath PM using the console cable with the corresponding adapter(s).

For more information about connecting directly to the PM's console, see "Making a Direct Connection for Console Access" on page 34.

#### Console Access through a Management Device

While integrating the PM device with a Cyclades console or KVM management device such as the AlterPath ACS or the AlterPath OnSite, remote users can access the AlterPath PM's console port through one of the following interfaces:

- Menu-driven interface After using telnet or SSH to access the console port equivalent to the managed device on the console server, type the power management hotkey (Ctrl+p by default) to bring up a power management menu on the same screen.
- Web interface Once you are logged into the Web Interface of the management device, access the power management functionality from a "Power Management" or "IPDU Power Management" tab on the Web Manager.




Figure 1-5: AlterPath PM8i






Figure 1-8: AlterPath PM10i Front

## **Gathering Required Equipment**

Collect the following equipment prior to installing and configuring the AlterPath PM in standalone configuration:

- One or more RJ-45 to RJ-45 straight-through cables.
- An RJ-45 to DB-9F straight-through adapter.
- A PC running a terminal emulation program.



## Setting Up the AlterPath PM

You can mount the AlterPath PM on a rack or wall or place it on a desktop or other flat surface. Two brackets are supplied with six Phillips screws for attaching the brackets to the AlterPath PM for mounting.

- If you are not mounting the AlterPath PM, place the AlterPath PM on a desk or table.
- If you are mounting the AlterPath PM, obtain a Phillips screwdriver and appropriate nuts and bolts before starting the following procedure.
- **Note:** When mounting an AlterPath PM 0U model to a wall stud, securely mount it by using a #10 or larger screw or use a drywall fastener rated min. 25 lb (11.34 kg).

The following graphics depict the orientation of the brackets for front rack mounting AlterPath PM.



#### Installation Environment

When installing AlterPath PM, ensure that the following environment specifications are met.

Environment Factor	Recommendation
Temperature	The manufacturer's maximum recommended ambient temperature for the AlterPath PM is 122 °F (50 °C).
Elevated Operating Ambient Temperature	If the AlterPath PM is installed in a closed or multi-unit rack assembly, the operating ambient temperature of the rack environment may be greater than room ambient temperature. Therefore, consideration should be given to installing the equipment in an environment compatible with the manufacturer's maximum rated ambient temperature. See above.
Reduced Air Flow	Installation of the equipment in a rack should be such that the amount of air flow required for safe operation of the equipment is not compromised.

Environment Factor	Recommendation
Mechanical Loading	Mounting of the equipment in the rack should be such that a hazardous condition is not achieved due to uneven mechanical loading.
Circuit Overloading	Consideration should be given to the connection of the equipment to the supply circuit and the effect that overloading of circuits might have on overcurrent protection and supply wiring. Appropriate consideration of equipment nameplate ratings should be used when addressing this concern.
Reliable Grounding	Reliable grounding of rack-mounted equipment should be maintained. Particular attention should be given to supply connections other than direct connections to the branch circuit, such as power strips or extension cords.

Table 2-6: AlterPath PM Optimum Installation Environment

**Important:** Install the AlterPath PM 0U model in a location where there is an adjacent and accessible wall socket outlet.

#### ▼ To Mount the AlterPath PM8i, PM10, or PM10i

**1.** Locate the appropriate sets of holes on the PM.



- **2.** Connect the two supplied brackets to the AlterPath PM, connecting one bracket to each side of the box.
- **3.** For each bracket, insert a screw through each of the three holes on the bracket into the appropriate holes at either end of the AlterPath PM.

The following figure shows the bracket flanges on the front of the AlterPath PM after the brackets are installed.



Brackets

- **4.** Use a Phillips screwdriver to tighten the screws.
- **5.** Use the mounting hardware recommended for your rack to mount the AlterPath PM on a rack as illustrated in the following graphic.

**Note:** The suggested minimum screw size for wall-mounting the AlterPath PM units is #10 (4.8 mm or 0.19 in or 3/16 in) or larger. The RJ-45 cable included in the AlterPath PM package is minimum flame rated VW-1 or FT-1 and has a maximum length of 10 feet (3 meters).




Figure 2-2: Rack Mount for the AlterPath PM8i

## **Daisy Chaining PMs**

You can manage a maximum of 128 outlets from a single work station by connecting slave PMs to the master PM device. See "Making a Direct Connection for Console Access" on page 34 for more details.

#### ▼ To Daisy Chain a PM

This procedure assumes that a master PM is already connected to a work station or to a Cyclades console or KVM device.

- Connect one end of an RJ-45 cable to the OUT port of the main AlterPath PM, which is connected to a work station or to a Cyclades console or KVM device (master).
- **2.** Connect the other end of the RJ-45 cable to the IN port of the secondary AlterPath PM (slave).
- **3.** To connect another PM to the slave, connect one end of an RJ-45 cable to the OUT port of the last PM in the chain.
- 4. Repeat Step 3 until you have connected the desired number of PMs.

You can control up to 128 power outlets in any combination of PM models.

## **Plugging Devices Into AlterPath PM Outlets**

In order to control power on a device, the device must be plugged into at least one of the AlterPath PM's power outlets.

## ▼ To Plug Devices Into AlterPath PM Outlets

- 1. Connect a device's power cable to one of the AlterPath PM's outlets.
- 2. Repeat step one until all of the AlterPath PM's power outlets are used.

## **Powering On the AlterPath PM**

Power on the AlterPath PM in order to begin managing power of its connected devices.

#### ▼ To Power On the AlterPath PM

- Plug the power cable into an adjacent AC power source.
- **Important:** The AlterPath PM must be powered by a receptacle with adequate circuit protection.

## **Making a Direct Connection for Console Access**

The system administrator must specify basic settings on the AlterPath PM before users can connect to and manage the unit and the connected devices. To prepare to perform necessary basic configuration, make a direct connection to the AlterPath PM by connecting a terminal or computer to the IN port as depicted in the following graphic.




Figure 2-3: Connecting a Local Work Station to the AlterPath PM

#### ▼ To Access the Console

Perform the following steps to connect a computer to the console port of the AlterPath PM. This procedure assumes that you know how to use a terminal emulation program.

On a PC, ensure that HyperTerminal or another terminal emulation program is installed on the Windows operating system. On a computer running a UNIX-based operating system, such as Solaris or Linux, make sure that a compatible terminal emulator, such as Kermit or Minicom, is installed.

- 1. Connect an RJ-45 serial cable to the IN port on the AlterPath PM.
- **2.** Connect the other end of the RJ-45 serial cable to the RJ-45 to DB-9F straight through adapter shipped with the PM.
- 3. Connect the adapter to a DB-9 serial port on a computer.

You may need to use a USB serial adapter in order to connect to the computer.

**4.** Using a terminal emulation program installed on a computer, start a session with the following console port settings:

Serial Speed: 9600 bps	Stop Bits: 1
Data Length: 8 bits	Flow Control: None
Parity: None	ANSI emulation

#### To Log Into the AlterPath PM Through the Console (In Port)

**1.** From your terminal emulation application, log into the console port as "admin".

```
AlterPath PM

As shown in the previous screen, the default password is "pm8." If the password has been changed from the default, use the new password.

- **2.** If this is a first-time installation, see "Initial Configuration Using the Command Prompt" on page 38 for instructions on changing the default password, adding users, and assigning outlets to users.
- **3.** See "Command Line Interface" on page 49, for procedures on logging in and using the console commands to manage power on connected devices.

# Chapter 3 Configuration

The AlterPath PM can be configured by any one of three methods:

- Command Prompt Full configuration capabilities.
- Browser Available only when used in an integrated configuration. This menu allows you to invoke the various PM operations, such as cycling, switching on/off, and basic configurations of the power management session to communicate with the PM. Only a limited number of parameters can actually be changed and saved to the PM.
- Text-based menu Available only when used in an integrated configuration. This menu allows you to invoke the various PM operations such as cycling, switching on/off, and more.

The following sections offer basic instructions for configuring, restoring the admin password, and uploading firmware on the AlterPath PM for either the standalone or the daisy-chained configuration.

For information about integrated use with the AlterPath ACS, Cyclades-TS, AlterPath KVM family of products, or the AlterPath OnSite, refer to the *AlterPath ACS Installation, Administration, and User's Guide*, the *Cyclades-TS User Guide*, the *AlterPath KVM/net Plus Installation, Configuration, and User's Guide*, or the *AlterPath OnSite Installation, Administration, and User's Guide* respectively.

## **Default Configuration Parameters**

The AlterPath PM's default configuration is as follows:

- User is admin.
- admin user's password is *pm8*.
- All outlets are *un-named*.
- All outlets are *unassigned to user*.
- All outlets are *turned on*.
- All outlets are *unlocked*.

# Initial Configuration Using the Command Prompt

To configure the AlterPath PM, you must have a work station connected to the console (In) port on the AlterPath PM and be logged in as the admin user. See "Making a Direct Connection for Console Access" on page 34 for instructions on connecting to the console. If needed, refer to Chapter 4. "Command Line Interface" on page 49 for a description of the command line interface and reference information on each of the commands described in the following procedures.

Use the following procedures to perform basic configuration:

To Change the Default Password	Page 39

#### To Change the Default Password

If the default password "pm8" is still in use, change the admin password.

```
Important: Changing the default password closes a security hole that could be easily exploited.
```

**1.** Login to the AlterPath PM.

Use the factory default username/password *admin/pm8*. A maximum of eight characters (not case sensitive) is allowed.

**2.** Enter the **passwd** command.

pm> passwd

**3.** Enter a new password when prompted.

```
Password: <new password>
Re-enter password: <new password>
Username/password set for user admin.
pm>
```

#### To Create Users Using the adduser Command

**1.** Login to the AlterPath PM.

The PM prompt appears

pm>

**2.** Enter the adduser command followed by the new username and enter the password when prompted.

```
pm> adduser jane
Password:
Re-enter password:
Username/password set for user jane.
```

#### To Assign Outlets to Users Using the assign Command

**1.** Login to the AlterPath PM.

The PM prompt appears.

pm>

2. Enter the assign command followed by the outlets and username.

```
pm>assign 2 jane
Outlet 2 assigned to jane.
```

#### To Name the Outlets Using the name Command

**1.** Login to the AlterPath PM.

The PM prompt appears.

pm>

**2.** Enter the name command followed by the outlet number and desired name of the outlet.

pm>name 2 chispa
2: Outlet now named chispa

#### To Save the Configuration Using the save Command

**1.** Login to the AlterPath PM.

The PM prompt appears.

pm>

**2.** Enter the save command to save the configuration.

```
pm>save
Saving configuration to flash on IPDU #1 ... Done.
Saving configuration to flash on IPDU #2 ... Done.
```

## **Resetting the Admin Password**

In the event the administrator wants to reset the password for the AlterPath PM (for example, if the administrator forgets the admin password), then the loopback connector that is shipped with the AlterPath PM can be used for temporary access to the PM.

#### ▼ To Reset the Admin Password Using the Loopback Connector

- 1. Do one of the following procedures:
  - **a.** If you are currently logged into the AlterPath PM as a regular user, log out by typing exit.
  - **b.** If you are already logged into the AlterPath PM as an administrator, proceed to Step 2.
- **2.** Attach the loopback connector.

Connect the loopback connector shipped with the product to the OUT port of the AlterPath PM. If necessary, disconnect any cables connected to the OUT port of the AlterPath PM to allow for the connection of the loopback.

**3.** Wait one minute and then check the display.

If you are watching the AlterPath PM's console output (using HyperTerminal or Minicom), messages like the ones shown below are displayed:

```
[ALTERPATH PM]: DCD went ON on output port of IPDU #1
[ALTERPATH PM]: Trying to detect loopback cable on
OUT port of ipdu #1
[ALTERPATH PM]: Loopback detected. Changing
administrator password to default.
[ALTERPATH PM]: Please remove the loopback cable now.
```

4. Remove the loopback connector.

After one minute, you can remove the loopback connector from the OUT port of the AlterPath PM. Now the password for the user *admin* is reset to the default (*pm8*), and you should be able to log into the AlterPath PM using the default username/password.

**5.** Change the password for the *admin*, if desired, by issuing the following command:

pm>passwd

- **6.** Execute the save command to complete the procedure.
- 7. If you need to recover the password of many AlterPath PMs connected in a daisy chain, go to Step 1 and perform the procedure on each AlterPath PM in the chain.

## **Upgrading the AlterPath PM Firmware**

Starting with version 1.1.0, the AlterPath PM firmware can be upgraded through its "In" port.

The upgrade procedure described here is only valid for units that are currently running firmware versions 1.3.0 or greater. If your AlterPath PM unit is running an older firmware version, please follow the instructions in the manual that corresponds to the firmware currently installed on the AlterPath PM. Older versions of this manual can be found at:

#### ▼ To Upgrade PM Firmware

1. Download the new AlterPath PM firmware from the Cyclades website.

The latest AlterPath PM firmware is available in the download section of the Cyclades website, at <u>http://www.cyclades.com/support/</u><u>downloads.php</u>

After downloading the AlterPath PM firmware file, save it to the workstation connected to the AlterPath PM console (IN port).

**2.** Using either Hyperterminal or Minicom, log into the AlterPath PM as admin and type in the command

pm> upgrade <ipdu number>

If you are currently logged in as a different user, log out and then login as admin.

The *<ipdu number>* is the number of the IPDU to which you want to upgrade the firmware. If you have only one AlterPath PM unit, type upgrade 1. If you have, for instance, three units in a daisy chain, type upgrade 3 or upgrade 2 depending on which unit you want to upgrade.

If you have a daisy chain and you want to upgrade all units, Cyclades advises you to start from the last unit and work your way towards the first.

After the upgrade command is executed, the boot loader menu is displayed at the console, as shown below:

**3.** At the boot loader menu, select the option 1 to upgrade the firmware.

The boot loader erases the firmware currently in the unit and asks you to upload the new firmware, as shown below:

**4.** Use your terminal emulator program to upload the AlterPath PM firmware file to the AlterPath PM using the Xmodem protocol.

## If you are using HyperTerminal in Windows, do the following procedure:

**a.** From the top menu select Transer>Send.

- **b.** Click the Browse button to set the proper path for the AlterPath PM firmware file located on your work station.
- **Note:** You must browse for the proper file and click the Send button within 10 seconds of selecting Transer>Send. If you fail to do so, an error message will appear and the transmission will fail. You will then be given another 10-second window in which to repeat steps b. through d.
  - **c.** Select Xmodem as the protocol.
  - **d.** Click on the Send button.

#### If you are using Minicom in Linux, do the following procedure:

**a.** From the main screen, press Ctrl A + S (for sending files).

The Upload popup window appears.

**b.** Select xmodem as the protocol.

The "Select a file for upload" window appears.

- **c.** Move the cursor next to AlterPath PM firmware file for upload, and press the Space key to tag it.
- **d.** Press the Enter key to start the file transfer.

If you use a different terminal emulator, please refer to the documentation provided by the manufacturer on how to transfer files using the Xmodem protocol.

If the file transfer is successful, the AlterPath PM console displays the login prompt. At this point, the upgrade process of the unit is complete; you may log into the AlterPath PM and perform actions as usual.

If the file transfer fails, an error message appears on the AlterPath PM console, and the boot loader menu is displayed again so you can redo the process.

The screen would be similar to the one shown below:

# Chapter 4 Command Line Interface

When using the AlterPath PM independently of other Cyclades products, users and administrators can access the PM command line interface through a terminal emulation program by making a console connection from a local computer to the IN port on the PM. See "To Access the Console" on page 35 for instructions.

The following sections describe the PM command line interface and the commands available to users and administrators:

- PM User Interface
- Commands

#### **PM User Interface**

You can access the PM user interface by following the instructions provided in "To Access the Console" on page 35. The menu that appears after connecting to the console depends on whether the PM has booted or not before you connect.

If you connect to the console before powering on the AlterPath PM or reboot while connected, the Boot Menu appears:

```
Boot Menu
1. Upgrade Firmware.
2. Boot Firmware.
Enter choice (1 or 2):
```

If the PM has already booted before you connect to the AlterPath PM through the console, the Login prompt appears

```
AlterPath PM

On the Boot Menu, do one of the following options: Do nothing or enter 2 to select the Boot Firmware option. The Login prompt appears.

The line [PM] : IPDU: If no PMs are daisychained, this line appears only once, and the value is 1.

If there are any PMs daisychained to the first PM (as shown in the example above), this line appears once for each PM in the chain. For each PM, the value is incremented by 1. The final appearance of this line will show the total number of PMs in the daisychain.

```
The line [PM] : OUT:
```

If no PMs are daisychained, this line appears only once, and the value is equal to the number of outlets on the PM.

If there are any PMs daisychained to the first PM (as shown in the example above), this line appears once for each PM in the chain. For each PM, the value shows the cumulative total of outlets until the total number of outlets for the entire chain is displayed.

After the "Username:" prompt, enter your username.

**Note:** If there are daisychained PMs, you will need to press "Enter" after the final "[PM]: OUT:" line appears.

After the "Password:" prompt, enter the password for the unsername entered.

The default user is *admin* with password *pm8*.

After a successful login, the PM command prompt appears after which you can use any of the commands described in "Commands" on page 52.

After logging in, the administrator can choose to change his or her password through the *passwd* command (seen later). Passwords can be set to null, which indicates that no password is needed.

**Note:** When a range of outlets is used in a command and the range spans more than one PM in a daisychain, the range of outlets must *not* be specified by name. The range of outlets can only be specified by number in this situation.

# adduser

Adds one username to the internal database. A maximum of eight characters (not case sensitive) is allowed, and a maximum of eight individual users is allowed. This command is available to the admin user only.

### Syntax

adduser <user>

#### Arguments

<user>

Desired username

### Examples

```
pm>adduser popper
Password:
Re-enter password:
Username/password set for user popper.
pm>
```

# alarm

Sets and reads the current threshold. This command is available to administrator only.

### Syntax

alarm <IPDU#> <threshold>

### Arguments

<ipdu#></ipdu#>	IPDU number in a daisy chain
<threshold></threshold>	The current threshold is the maximum allowed current on the power strip
no argument	Displays alarm status of all PMs in the daisychain

#### Examples

To set the threshold, type:

```
pm>alarm 1 5.6
Setting alarm threshold on IPDU #1 to 5.6A
pm>alarm 2 7.8
Setting alarm threshold on IPDU #2 to 7.8A
```

To read the threshold, type:

pm>**alarm** Alarm threshold on IPDU #1 is 5.6A Alarm threshold on IPDU #2 is 7.8A

# assign

Assigns an outlet to a given user. The user is then be able to manage such outlets. This command is available to the administrator user only.

### Syntax

assign <outlet\_number> <user>

### Arguments

<outlet_number></outlet_number>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5"
<user></user>	Desired username

#### Examples

To assign outlet 4, 6, 7, and 8 to user *tess*, type:

pm>assign 4, 6-8 tess
4: Outlet assigned to tess.
6: Outlet assigned to tess.
7: Outlet assigned to tess.
8: Outlet assigned to tess.

# buzzer

Displays or changes the buzzer notification status. A buzzer may sound when there is an overcurrent situation.

#### Syntax

buzzer on off status

#### Arguments

on	Enables buzzer
off	Disables buzzer
status	Displays the buzzer status

#### Examples

To get the current status of the buzzer notification, type:

pm> <b>buzzer</b>		status			
Buzzer	is	ON	on	IPDU	#1
Buzzer	is	ON	on	IPDU	#2

To turn buzzer notification on or off, type:

```
pm>buzzer on
Buzzer turned ON on IPDU #1
Buzzer turned ON on IPDU #2
pm>buzzer off
Buzzer turned OFF on IPDU #1
Buzzer turned OFF on IPDU #2
```

### current

Displays the total current drawn by AlterPath PM units and the maximum current the unit has drawn (current peak). It can also be used to clear the saved peak current value.

#### Syntax

current <IPDU#> reset

#### Arguments

<ipdu#></ipdu#>	IPDU number in a daisy chain
reset	Clears the saved peak current value

#### Examples

To get the current status for all units, type:

```
pm> current
IPDU #1: True RMS current: 2.2A. Maximum current: 9.4A
IPDU #2: True RMS current: 2.0A. Maximum current: 10.2A
```

To get the current status for a specific unit, type:

pm> current 2
IPDU #2: True RMS current: 2.4A. Maximum current: 10.2A

To reset maximum current drawn, type:

pm>current reset
IPDU #1: Clearing maximum recorded current to zero.
IPDU #2: Clearing maximum recorded current to zero.

# currentprotection

Turns on and off the over current protection feature. The overcurrent protection does not let any outlet be turned on if the current drawn by the unit is greater than the current threshold configured with the command alarm. This command can also be used to display the current protection status. This command is only available to the administrative user.

### Syntax

currentprotection <on|off|status>

### Arguments

on	Enables over current protection
off	Disables over current protection
status	Displays the current protection status

### Examples

To display current protection status for all units, type:

```
pm>currentprotection status
IPDU #1: Overcurrent protection is OFF.
IPDU #2: Overcurrent protection is OFF.
```

To enable current protection status for all units, type:

```
pm>currentprotection ON
IPDU #1: Overcurrent protection turned ON.
IPDU #2: Overcurrent protection turned ON.
```

To disable current protection status for all units, type:

pm>currentprotection off
IPDU #1: Overcurrent protection turned OFF.
IPDU #2: Overcurrent protection turned OFF.

### currseg

View the current for the lower or upper segment of outlets. This command is only useful for IPDUs with dual current sensors (30A and 32A models). The lower segment (segment A) would be outlets 1-5 on a PM 10 series IPDU, and the upper segment (segment B) would be outlets 6-10 on a PM 10 series IPDU.

#### Syntax

currseg A B [reset]

#### Arguments

AB	segment A or segment B
reset	Clears the max recorded current for A & B.

#### Example

To view the current load of segment A, type:

```
pm>currseg A
IPDU #1: True RMS current for segment A: 0.4A. Maximum current for segment A: 0.
4A
```

#### To view the current load of segment B, type:

pm>**currseg B** IPDU #1: True RMS current for segment B: 2.5A. Maximum current for segment B: 2. 5A To reset the maximum recorded current for A and B, type:

pm>currseg reset
IPDU #1: Clearing maximum recorded current for segment A and B to zero.
IPDU #2: Clearing maximum recorded current for segment A and B to zero.

# cycle

Power cycles an outlet or groups of outlets. You can use the outlet number or the outlet name (see command name for details).

### Syntax

cycle all | <outlet\_string>

### Arguments

all	Cycles all outlets in the PM or PM daisychain
<outlet_string></outlet_string>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5"

#### Examples

To cycle one outlet, type:

pm> cycle 3
3: Outlet turned off.
3: Outlet turned on.

To cycle multiple outlets, type:

pm:	<pre>&gt;cycle 2</pre>	2, 3, 5.	-7
2:	Outlet	turned	off.
3:	Outlet	turned	off.
5:	Outlet	turned	off.
6:	Outlet	turned	off.
7:	Outlet	turned	off.
2:	Outlet	turned	on.
3:	Outlet	turned	on.
5:	Outlet	turned	on.
6:	Outlet	turned	on.
7:	Outlet	turned	on.

# deluser

Deletes one username from the internal database. This command is available to the administrative user *only*.

#### Syntax

deluser <user>

#### Arguments

<user>

Desired username

#### Examples

To delete the user *rog*, type:

```
pm>deluser rog
Username deleted.
```

# display

Allows logical inversion of the 2-digit, 7-segment display. The primary purpose of this command is to allow a PM unit to be mounted with the display upside-down. This command is available to the administrative user *only*.

**Note:** The decimal point will be at the top of the display when the PM is mounted upside down.

### Syntax

display <IPDU#> <0|180> or

display

### Arguments

IPDU#	number of the PM in the chain
0	normal mode (default)
180	inverted display
no argument	show display status of all PMs in the daisychain.

### Examples

To set the display if IPDU #2 to inverted mode, type:

```
pm>display 2 180
IPDU #2: Display mode set to 180 degrees rotated.
```

To set the display of IPDU #1 to normal mode, type:

```
pm>display 1 0
IPDU #1: Display mode set to normal.
```

To view the display status, type:

pm>display
IPDU #1: Display mode set to normal.
IPDU #2: Display mode set to 180 degrees rotated.

# exit

Exits the session.

### Syntax

exit

### Arguments

N/A

#### Examples

To exit the current session, type:

```
pm>exit
AlterPath PM

V 1.8.0 Jan 9, 2006
Username:
```

# factory\_defaults

Resets the unit to its factory configuration so that all outlets are on, unlocked, unnamed, and no users are created. When used with a daisy chain, this command resets all units in the chain.

### Syntax

factory\_defaults

### Arguments

N/A

#### Examples

To reset the factory defaults, type:

```
pm>factory_defaults
Setting configuration to defaults on IPDU #1
1: Outlet turned on.
2: Outlet turned on.
3: Outlet turned on.
4: Outlet turned on.
5: Outlet turned on.
6: Outlet turned on.
7: Outlet turned on.
8: Outlet turned on.
Saving configuration to flash on IPDU #1 ... done.
```

# help

Displays the system help message for all commands or for a single command when specified.

#### Syntax

```
<command> help
```

or

help

### Arguments

<command>

Any available command

### Examples

To view the system help message for a specific command, type the command and then type "help":

```
pm>syslog help
Usage: syslog <on|off|status>
Turn the syslog messages on the console on or off
```

<pm_name></pm_name>	Desired name of the PM
no argument	Displays the IDs of all PMs in the daisychain

To set the ID of PM 1 R&D, type:

pm>**id 1 R&D** IPDU #1: id = R&D

To display the ID of PM 2, type:

pm>**id 2** IPDU #2: id = QA

To display the IDs of all PMs in the daisychain, type:

# interval

Configures the power up interval for each outlet in the system. The power up interval of an outlet is the time (in seconds) the unit will wait, after turning this outlet on, to turn on any other outlet. This command is available to the administrator only.

#### Syntax

interval <outlet\_number> <duration>

#### Arguments

<duration> Sets the power up interval of outlets. Valid intervals
 are from 0.00 to 100.
 Default value is 0.5.

**Note:** When this value is set to 0.0, there is still a power up interval of approximately 0.1 seconds between outlets.

#### Examples

To display the interval of outlet 1, type:

```
pm>interval 1
1: Outlet power on interval is 0.00 sec.
```

To set the interval of outlets 2, 4, 5, and 6 to a value of 2.40, type:

pm>interval 2,4-6 2.4

# list

List users created and outlets assigned to each user (for the administrator), or just the outlets assigned to the user logged in at the moment (for the regular user).

list

N/A

#### Examples

As *admin*, to list user names in the internal database, type:

pm>list

gregg george mila sarah	1-3 4, 6-7, 9 5, 8 4-9

As mila, to list user names in the internal database, type::

pm>list	
User	Outlets
mila	5, 8

# lock

Locks an outlet or group of outlets in the current state. The response to this command is a list of status lines, one per power port. This command works on all PMs in a daisychain.

#### Syntax

lock all|<outlet\_string>

#### Arguments

#### Examples

To lock outlets 1, 2, and 6, type:

```
pm>lock 1,2,6
1: Outlet locked.
2: Outlet locked.
6: Outlet locked.
```

### name

Names an outlet. A maximum of 16 alphabetic and numeric characters (not case sensitive) is allowed with these exceptions:

- The hyphen (-), percent (%), and comma (,) characters are not allowed.
- Numeric characters are not allowed as the first character of a name.

This command is available to the administrator user only.

#### Syntax

```
name <outlet_number> <name>
```

#### Arguments

<outlet number> Outlet number, such as "5"
<name> Desired outlet name

#### Examples

To name outlet 4 as *nowhere*, type:

pm>name 4 nowhere
4: Outlet now named nowhere

# off

Turns an outlet or group of outlets off. This command works on outlets in a PM daisychain.

#### **Syntax**

off all < outlet string>

#### Arguments

all	Turns off all outlets in the PM or PM daisychain
<outlet_string></outlet_string>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5"

**Caution:** The "all" argument will turn off all outlets in a PM or PM daisychain.

#### Examples

To turn all outlets off, type:

pm:	off all	L	
1:	Outlet	turned	off.
2:	Outlet	turned	off.
3:	Outlet	turned	off.
4:	Outlet	turned	off.
5:	Outlet	turned	off.

To turn off outlets 2 through 7 (or all outlets except 1 and 8 in a single PM8), type:

```

# on

Turns an outlet or a group of outlets on. If more than one outlet is selected there will be an interval between outlets being powered on, the interval is defined by the interval command. This command works on outlets in a PM daisychain.

### Syntax

on all < outlet\_string>

#### Arguments

all	Turns on all outlets in the PM or PM daisychain
<outlet_string></outlet_string>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5".

#### Examples

To turn on outlets 1, 3, 4, and 5, type:

```
pm>on 1, 3-5
1: Outlet turned on.
3: Outlet turned on.
4: Outlet turned on.
5: Outlet turned on.
```

# passwd

Sets a password. The Administrator has a default password (pm8), which can be changed. Regular users can change or set only their own password. The Administrator can change his or her own password or any regular user's password.

#### Syntax

passwd <user\_name>

#### Arguments

<user_name></user_name>	Name of the user whose password is being changed
no argument	To change admin password if logged in as admin
	To change <user> password if logged in as <user></user></user>

#### Examples

To change the password for user *alpha*, when logged in as *admin*, type:

```
pm>passwd alpha
Password:
Re-enter password:
Username/password set for user alpha.
```

To change the admin password (must be logged in as *admin*), type:

```
pm>passwd
Password: <new password>
Re-enter password:
Username/password set for user admin.
```

To change the password of a regular user when logged in as that user, type:

```
pm>passwd
Password:
Re-enter password:
Username/password set for user gregg.
```

# reboot

Reboots the PM units. You can also reboot a specific unit number. Issuing the reboot command without a parameter reboots the first unit in a chain, not all the units in a chain.

### Syntax

```
reboot
or
reboot <IPDU#>
```

#### Arguments

*<IPDU#>* IPDU number in a daisy chain

#### Examples

To reboot the first unit of the chain, or to reboot the unit in stand alone mode, type:

```
pm>reboot
```

[PM]: OUT: 10
pm>[PM]: DCD went ON on output port of IPDU #1
[PM]: IPDU: 2
[PM]: OUT: 18
```

# restore

Restores the configuration currently saved in flash.

#### Syntax

restore

#### Arguments

N/A

#### Examples

To restore the configuration currently saved in flash, type:

```
pm>restore
1: Outlet turned on.
2: Outlet turned on.
3: Outlet turned on.
4: Outlet turned on.
5: Outlet turned on.
6: Outlet turned on.
7: Outlet turned on.
8: Outlet turned on.
```

### save

Saves the current configuration in the flash device built in to all AlterPath PM units. This command saves the username/password database and the specific information pertaining to each outlet such as outlet name, outlet assignments, outlet state.

If you save your configuration to flash it will be restored after the next reboot. If you do not save your configuration to flash you will lose it all after the next reboot.

#### Syntax

save

### Arguments

N/A

### Examples

To save the configuration to flash, type:

```
pm>save
Saving configuration to flash on IPDU #1 ... Done.
Saving configuration to flash on IPDU #2 ... Done.
```

An error message will be displayed if there is an error while writing the configuration to flash.

# status

Displays the status of selected outlets.

#### Syntax

status all|<outlet\_string>

#### Arguments

<outlet_string></outlet_string>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5"
all	Displays the status of all outlets in a PM or PM daisychain

#### Examples

To display the status of outlet 1, type:

pm> <b>status 1</b>			
Outlet Name	Status	Interval (s)	Users
1 g1	Unlocked ON	0.00	gregg

To display the status of all outlets, type:

pm> <b>st</b>	atus all

# syslog

Displays or changes the syslog notification status.

#### Syntax

syslog on off status

#### Arguments

on	Enables message to be displayed in the console when there is an over current situation
off	Disables the message notification
status	Displays the current syslog status of all PMs on the daisychain
no argument	Same as status

### Examples

To get the current status of the syslog notification use syslog, type:

```
pm>syslog
Syslog is ON on IPDU #1
Syslog is ON on IPDU #2
```

To turn on and off the syslog notification use syslog on or syslog off type:,

```
pm>syslog on
Syslog turned ON on IPDU #1
Syslog turned ON on IPDU #2
pm>syslog off

# temperature

This command displays the AlterPath PM unit's surrounding temperature and the maximum temperature the unit has registered (temperature peak). It can also be used to clear the saved peak temperature value.

<ipdu#></ipdu#>	IPDU number in a daisy chain
reset	Resets the maximum temperature registered

#### Examples

To get the temperature for all units in a daisy chain, type:

pm> temperature

# unlock

Unlocks an outlet or group of outlets in the current state. The response to this command is a list of status lines, one per power port.

unlock all <outlet\_string>

<outlet_string></outlet_string>	Outlet number, such as "5", outlet name such as "sunfire", or group of outlets such as "1, 3-5"
all	Unlocks all outlets in the PM or PM daisychain

#### Examples

To unlock outlets 2, 3, 4, and 8, type:

pm>unlock 2-4,8
2: Outlet unlocked.
3: Outlet unlocked.
4: Outlet unlocked.
8: Outlet unlocked.

# upgrade

This command is available only to the administrator. This command goes directly to the boot options menu before actually rebooting. You have the options:

- 1. Upgrade Firmware.
- 2. Boot Firmware.
- **Note:** For details on upgrading using the upgrade command or using the reboot command, see "Upgrading the AlterPath PM Firmware" on page 43.

### Syntax

upgrade <IPDU#>

### Arguments

<IPDU#>

IPDU#, such as "1". This can also be the IPDU number of an IPDU daisychained to the one to which you are connected. If you wish to upgrade more than one IPDU, it is recommended that you upgrade the most remote IPDU first.

#### Examples

To upgrade 1, type:

```
pm>upgrade 1

no argument	Displays version information for the PM and for all PMs in a daisychain

To view the current software version of all IPDUs in a daisy chain, type:

pm>ver IPDU #1: Hw with 10 outlets 16 AMPs max Sw V 1.8.0 Jan 9, 2006 id mila model 7 IPDU #2: Hw with 8 outlets 15 AMPs max Sw V 1.8.0 Jan 9, 2006 id sarah model 23

**Note:** If an IPDU has an id assigned to it, the ver command displays the word "id" followed by the name of the IPDU and the model number of the PM unit; however, if no id is configured for the IDPU, the ver command displays the word "id" without a name following it as shown below:

To get this information for a specific unit, provide the unit number as an argument.

pm>**ver 2** IPDU #2: Hw with 8 outlets 15 AMPs max Sw V 1.8.0 Jan 9, 2006 id sarah model 23

# whoami

Shows the username of the user currently logged in.

#### **Syntax**

whoami

### Arguments

N/A

#### Examples

To view the current username, type:

pm>**whoami** admin

# **PM Units with One Circuit Breaker**

Only one circuit breaker is used for the following units:

- PM8-15A
- PM8-20A
- PM8-L20
- PM10-15A
- PM10-20A
- PM10-L20
- PM20-20A
- PM20-L20
- PM20i-16A
- PM20i-20A

In the event of a current overload in any of these units, the entire unit shuts down causing all outlets to disconnect.

### PM8i and PM10i

The PM8i and some versions of the PM10i (10, 15, 16, and 20 amps) have two circuit breakers each. Both circuit breakers are designed to protect different phases of the same circuit inside the unit. If either one of the two circuit breakers trips, the entire unit will shut down.

## PM10-L30A

The PM10-L30A has two 15-amp circuit breakers. The first circuit breaker controls outlets 1 through 5 and the power supply to the logic board; the second circuit breaker controls outlets 6 through 10. If the total current flow to outlets 6 through 10 exceeds 15 amps due to equipment connected to these outlets, then the second circuit breaker will trip causing outlets 6 through 10 to shut down. This does not affect outlets 1 through 5, which are controlled by the first circuit breaker.

If, however, current overload causes the first circuit breaker to trip, then the entire power unit shuts down because the power supply is also tied to the first circuit breaker.

Refer to Table C-20, "Circuit Breaker Trip Time," on page 118 to determine the time it takes for the circuit breaker to trip based on the amount of current overload.




Figure C-1: PM10-L30A Circuit Breakers

### PM10i-L30A




Figure C-2: PM10i-L30A Circuit Breakers

This does not affect outlets 1 through 10 which is controlled by the second circuit breaker.

If, however, current overload causes the second circuit breaker to trip, then the entire power unit shuts down because the power supply is also tied to the second circuit breaker.




Figure C-3: PM20-L30A Circuit Breakers




Figure C-4: PM20i-L30A Circuit Breakers
